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COUNSELLOR'S CORNER

'I think I'm depressed'. School counsellors are hearing students say this in the past few years. Before that, it was unusual for kids to use the word 'depressed', though that may have been an accurate description of their feelings. Increased awareness, public discussion, and the availability of simple online questionnaires have enabled easier recognition and labelling of mood states. How would you recognise depression in your children? A big survey of 3000 Australian young people shows that parents/carers may not realise when their kids are depressed. When young people (aged 11-17) were asked directly, one in 13 (8%) had experienced depression in the previous 12 months, with higher rates among girls than boys. That's about 2 in every classroom. CAREERS REPORT: UAC ADVICE FOR YEAR 12

Year 12 students have received their UAC Guides and are now in the process of finalising their UAC entries for 2017. To familiarise themselves with the UAC Guide students can follow these simple steps: Familiarise yourself with Part 1, page 9-46, read pages 21-29 carefully, which explains the application process, (there is also a YouTube video on the UAC website which explains the application process and is worth viewing) and research TABLE 1 on page 48 which will give you the ATAR CUT-OFFS for the various university courses. Don't forget about attending the university Open Days and that the deadline for on-time applications is 30th September!
