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



Young people with mental health problems are absent from school more, are performing more poorly, and like school less compared to their peers who do not have mental health issues. One Australian child in 7 had a mental health problem in the past 12 months. In our school of over 1100 students that's more than 150 young people on average each year. While that rate has stayed constant since the first national survey in 1998, the good news is that the use of health and education services for support has increased substantially. <u>READ MORE ></u>
