### **Focus on Attendance**

Student academic and social achievement and attendance at school are key priorities for us at St John Paul II Catholic College. With this in mind, we would like to assert the connection between the two. We know that students who attend almost every day of school do well in all aspects of their education. Research tells us that students who do not attend school regularly do not achieve academically or socially as well as their peers whose attendance at school is regular. In fact, a student who misses 10% of school days between kindergarten and the end of Year 10 effectively misses a total of one whole year of their education.

The Learning Continuum focuses on implementing stage based ways of learning that allow students to develop learning skills and knowledge that can be utilised and extended as they continue through their stages of high school. The skills and knowledge students learn in **Stage 4 Cooperative Learning** is necessary for the students to continue to **Stage 5 Active Learning**, where they further develop skills and knowledge.
