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From the Principal - Mr Fanning

This term we have witnessed a number of exciting and energizing college events which have included our 2016 HSC High Achievers Assembly, the Year 7 Welcome BBQ, the Opening School Mass and our recent Open Evening. Each event has helped develop our great community at St John Paul II and each one has enhanced our community faith formation and educational endeavours.

Onto matters of practical importance to current families it must be noted that the changeover from summer to winter uniform for Term 2 is always difficult to determine with our changing weather patterns. However, we have decided that Week 1 being the changeover period when students can choose to wear winter or summer uniform — not a mixture of them — depending on the weather, with the beginning of Week 2 being the time all students should be in their Winter Uniform.

To assist with your planning, our next Staff Learning - Pupil Free Day is Monday 24 April with Tuesday 25 April being ANZAC Day - Public Holiday. Thus all Year 7-12 students will return to classes for the commencement of Term 2 on Wednesday 26 April.

STAGE 5 UPDATE: ELECTIVES & LEARNING ENRICHMENT



Year 11 have quickly settled into life at Nirimba. In their first term they have participated in liturgies, attended excursions and have undertaken a six week program on developing their study skills and understanding how their preliminary and HSC years will work. It has been a frantic term for the year 12 cohort. Amazingly, the year 12 students are half way through their final year of school. Term 1 has included significant events, such as receiving their jerseys, a special BBQ breakfast and half yearly examinations.

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COUNSELLOR'S CORNER

Research tells us that 70-80% of people who go to counselling about relationships and life's problems benefit from it, an improvement is that double the rate of those in control groups. But there are many types of counselling available from people trained with varying qualifications.

So how do you choose? Counsellor? Family therapist? Psychologist? Psychiatrist? Social Worker? Psychotherapist? Research suggests that there is very little difference in effectiveness, if any, between mainstream types of treatment. They all have good evidence to show they work with similar impact. (Note, this is true of mainstream treatments and may not be true of others.) What makes a bigger difference are factors that are common across types of therapy and therapists.

In summary: counselling works best when you (the client) believe it can actually help, and your counsellor can form a positive relationship with you where you both work together to make things better using an evidence-supported therapy.
