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COUNSELLOR'S CORNER

Unexplained nausea, headaches, crying, clinging, refusing to go to school or get out of the car on arrival – and that's just the teachers having problems! But some teenagers also struggle to get to school, or rather, they struggle with parents/carers so they can stay at home, and sometimes that's down to separation anxiety. Anxiety around separation can re-emerge when new threats to safety become apparent, and that might show up as refusing to go to school.

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JUMP ON THE YEAR 7 SOCIAL JUSTICE TRAIN



Year 7 have formed a social justice committee and have been working on a number of throughout projects semester two. The self nominated group of over 35 students, have been liaising with their Stage Team, St John Paul II Catholic College staff community and members to collect literacy resources for remote Indigenous communities.

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
